ADULT FORUM 2005

Co-Chairs: Anne Farrell and Jim Semelroth

Purpose of Committee: To provide a forum on current issues, in-depth travel experiences, subjects of interest

Ongoing Activities: Meetings are held during the second service, usually on the second and fourth Sundays, from September through June. Speakers are from the church and the community.

July 2004-May 2005 Accomplishments: This was our first full year in this time slot and we have had excellent attendance and some wonderful feedback. We have introduced two on-going programs - a Science series and a series on American Jurisprudence both given by our own members, which have been very well attended.

AESTHETICS 2005

Committee members: Ruth McCoy, Sheila Raymond

Purpose: The committee exists to maintain an aesthetically pleasing ambiance in our church facility.

Ongoing activities and tasks:

- Select capital investments of furnishings, decorative art and arrangement of same.
- Decide on acceptance and placement of donated items.
- Work with committees on their needs as to placement of bulletin boards, informational material and containers for items being collected for social services.
- Coordinate decorating for Christmas and Easter, always considering the opinions of the Minister and the Worship committee.
- On occasion, if the job is too large for the Worship committee, participate in the creation of a special display for a service topic such as "The Day of the Dead".
- To be consulted on any proposed structural changes to the building.

July 2004 to May 2005 accomplishments:

- Coordinated, at Randi Winters instigation and with her help, the installation of the revolving displays of artwork in the Social Hall.
- Researched, designed and installed the display table for the "The Day of the Dead".
- With volunteers from our committee and the church members at large, supplied flowers for the sanctuary on a regular basis.
- Maintained the arrangement of furnishings, wall treatments and plants in the front vestibules, social hall, and sanctuary.
- A donation was made to pay professional carpet cleaners.

Challenges in the coming year:

- To retain continuity and maintenance of furnishings, carpets and walls while staying within our limited budget.
- To keep the carpets and chairs clean, a major issue in the maintenance of the facility exacerbated with the addition of the Seventh Day Adventist congregation.
- To work together amicably with the congregation as we attempt to be the "arbiters of good taste".

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE 2005

Members: Jim Semelroth, Carole Shannon, Rob Balmuth, and Marie Ferguson, with the VP of Finance and Treasurer ex officio.

Purpose of the committee: The purpose of this committee is to study and then recommend action regarding the viability of a capital campaign for UUCSC. This would include the encouraging, acceptance and acknowledgement of gifts; arranging for the professional accounting of the funds; report on fund activities to the Board and the Congregation; ensure appropriate checks and balances in power over the funds are maintained; administer the distribution of the funds; and provide a quarterly status report to the Board.

Accomplishments 2004-2005: Committee members met, researched, and discussed the preceding over three meetings (Feb/Mar/April) wherein it was concluded that a capital campaign effort could be implemented.

The committee then requested funds from the Board of Directors for a 2-day consultation, to be held with UUA-approved consultant Larry Wheeler. The funds were approved and subsequent meetings with Wheeler occurred on April 29 & 30 which included the Board, the minister, and other pertinent committees.

The next step will be Board approval to retain Wheeler for further assistance and consultation. If approved, a 3-day meeting this summer with him will follow. Then, in late fall an important financial feasibility study would be conducted by Wheeler which would provide UUCSC with an accurate picture of what we could expect to raise in the ensuing capital campaign, which would get underway in 2006 in conjunction with the annual pledge drive.

Challenges the committee faces in the coming year. The challenge for the Capital Campaign Committee is to move forward in this first-ever venture to raise funds for our own church home.

CARING 2005

Names of committee members, and number of openings, if any: Betty Elliott, Laura Jackson, Charlotte Clarke, Mary Ruth Johnson, Susan Jagielko, Connie Carlton. No openings at present. Harold Boerlin has expressed interest and will be glad to step into a vacancy.

Purpose of the Committee: to provide support and assistance to members in times of meaningful life events and crises, such as a death in the family, a serious illness, recovery following surgery, etc.

On-going activities and tasks:

- sending cards (sympathy, thinking of you, etc.) and making phone calls;
- providing meals;
- sometimes help with transportation to church or shopping, or to doctor's appointments;
- assistance with child care;
- recording joys and concerns at Sunday services and e-mailing summaries to Rev. John.
- making phone calls to let members know of the death of a member/spouse/family member, or to advise of a memorial service.
- providing help with memorial services at the church, setting up food in the social hall, arranging flowers, etc.

All the above activities may involve some coordination among Rev. John, the chair and the committee members.

July 2004-May 2005 Accomplishments:

- Provided meals to Kelley O'Neill and her family after the death of Gary Copeland, plus helped with some arrangements for child care. This was for several weeks the end of August, beginning of Sept, 2004.
- Provided meals for the Johnson family following Mary Ruth's surgery in December. We provided meals for two-three weeks in January 2005, plus Connie Carlton contributed child care. Other church members not on the Caring Committee volunteered with meals and child care as well.

New activities undertaken: none

Challenges the committee faces in the coming year:

Maintaining members on the committee. So far we have a good group of volunteers who seem enthusiastic and committed, and Harold Boerlin waiting in the wings. So that is a good sign.

- Provide support and encouragement the DRE in all her many efforts including:
- Coordination and support of teacher volunteers for curriculum Sundays
- Providing monthly Youth Worship events
- Monitoring attendance in each class
- Budgeting and procurement of supplies
- Holding monthly committee meetings
- New member recruitment

July 2004-May 2005 Accomplishments:

- A Halloween Party was held
- 2 teacher training sessions were held
- A teacher recognition event was organized
- Attendance on Sundays has been high and increasing throughout the year
- Attendance at de Benneville camps (both adults and children) was high
- Many successful social action events were held, including raising money for the rainforest, donating a goat through the Heifer Project, raising vegetable seedlings for the Second Harvest farm and planting shrubs at the Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary

COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING COMMITTEE 2005

Chair: John Alcorn

Purpose: The purpose of this committee is to develop a detailed plan of how we (the congregation as a whole, and not just the committee) want the church to grow and improve, on a yearly basis, for the next five years. The plan addresses committees, staff, facilities and all other aspects of our church life.

Challenges for the Coming Year: The committee intends to submit the draft plan to the board at the board's July meeting, and request the board to consider it for one month and then vote, at the board's August meeting, on whether to send the plan (as submitted by the committee) to the congregation for a vote, or to return the plan to the committee with specific recommendations for further development, or to amend the plan and send it to the congregation for a vote.

If the board decides to send the plan (as submitted by the committee or as amended by the board) to the congregation, we suggest that an information congregational meeting be held on the second Sunday of September, and that a congregational meeting for the purpose of voting on the plan be held on the fourth Sunday of September.

The committee has been meeting twice each month. If the plan is adopted by the congregation, the committee will continue to meet, but on a quarterly basis, and monitor developments. At the end of each year the committee will submit a report to the congregation as to its assessment of how performance has been measured against the plan. If necessary, the committee will propose amendments/up-dates/revisions to the plan on an annual basis.

FINANCE 2005

Chair: Alan Hull VP Finance. The Finance committee has no other members at present.

Purpose

The Finance Committee provides oversight and direction of the UUCSC financial affairs. Particular tasks include:

- Establishment of the Annual Budget;
- Management of investments;
- Liaison with the Treasurer on monthly income and expenses; and
- Liaison with other Committees on financial matters

Review of July 2004-May 2005

The past financial year has continued to be dominated by funding our ongoing growth. We had a projected deficit of \$10,000 to be financed by further reduction of the UUCSC reserves. Current projections suggest that the deficit will be less, in part due to increased income by sub-leasing our facility to another Church group for \$1000/month. Other key aspects of the past financial year include:

- Underpayment of Pledges. We projected 3% growth in Pledges, but will probably fall short on Pledge income by almost 10%. Attrition of Members and changed financial circumstances are the probable cause of reduced Pledge income.
- Very difficult cash flow management. Almost 85% of our expenses go to salaries and rent. Cash outflows are predictable. Most income is from Pledges, which were received irregularly. We managed our cash flow by transfers from the Piano and Scrip accounts, and e-mail pleas for Pledges.
- Very responsible management of expenses by all committees, particularly CRE and Ways and Means.
- Our Church facility was leased for \$1000/month from February 2004. Increased rental income exceeded budget by about \$4000.
- More than 10% (\$3000) above budget for fundraising. We are blessed with a superb Ways and Means Committee whose personal efforts have helped hold our financial year together.
- About 150% increase in SCRIP income to about \$7000 against a target of \$10,000.
- Two generous, one-off gifts. One of \$3000 to the Plate and one of about \$4700 of stock to our investments.

- A bequest from the estate of a former member for \$25,000.
- Establishment of the Capital Campaign Committee to begin the process of acquiring our own Church facility.

Looking Forward

Our key financial objectives for the upcoming year must be to:

- Balance our Budget;
- Collect all our Pledges; and
- Manage our cash flow more effectively.

We propose to provide more regular statements to all Members that include the amount pledged and payment due. Our financial processes and reporting should be improved by the purchase of more up-to-date and user friendly software. We will also look to better cash flow processes by increasing our operating cash reserves.

A special thanks must go to our outgoing Treasurer—Dave Keen. He has been the one who has had to manage the day-to-day demands for payments to suppliers, staff, landlord and Committees. His huge volunteer commitment has ensured we have met our financial commitments on time. Thanks Dave!

HOSPITALITY 2005

The Hospitality Committee has divided into a Coffee/Set Up group and a Snack group. Lori Williams maintains the list of Coffee/Set Up volunteers each Sunday. The Snack coordinator position is vacant.

MAINTENANCE AND JANITORIAL 2005

NEW FACILITY COMMITTEE 2005

Purpose:

- Document data on the existing facility, including cost per square foot and usage. Conclusion; the \$0.99 per square foot we are paying seems to be a good value as built-out space such as ours is typically costing \$1.10 - \$1.25 per square foot.
- Create a facilities requirement document using the results of the Cottage Meetings and input from various areas of the congregation
- Use this document to assess opportunities for alternative facilities such as different building lease, purchase of existing building, share a facility, or buy land and build.
- Provide a status report to the Board at least quarterly
- Deliver a document containing a facility assessment and future facility requirements, target due date May 2005.

On-Going activities and tasks: A partial committee has met twice and reviewed the 13 pages of notes from the Cottage Meetings in April 2003. There is so much data and varying opinions that it is difficult to draw any conclusions. I think it is more productive to follow the steps that Larry Wheeler has laid out.

Accomplishments:

1. A cursory review shows that we most likely will not get a better deal leasing anywhere else.
2. Reviewed the Long-range Planning Notes from April 2003
3. Participated in two meeting with the consultant Larry Wheeler.
4. Downloaded and reviewed the First Home Grant Application, the Site Acquisition Program document, and the suggested timetable.
5. Contacted Dr. Wayne Clarke at the UUA for clarification on the programs.

Activities Undertaken:

1. Start working on the First Home Grant Application
2. Start looking for possible sites and contacting congregations that may need to sell their buildings
3. Need to get and analyze the geographic data that Dave Salahi has put together for where members live. (I'll e-mail Dave for the data).

Challenges:

1. The biggest challenge at the moment is to complete the First Home Grant application.
2. The next challenge is to get the congregation to agree on geographic boundaries where the church should be located.
3. Another challenge is to find time to do all the necessary work that is going to be required.

Ways and Means expects to exceed budgeted income.

SUMMARY AND CHALLENGES FOR 2005/2006

The Ways and Means Committee is a very cohesive group. Each member diligently contributes ideas, revenue, and labor to make the fund raising events successful both financially and socially. In addition, the Committee wishes to recognize contributions of other individuals such as Dana Freeman, Bill Hunker, Cel and Gary Livesey, John Alcorn, Jim Semelroth, and Carole Shannon who were each involved in a special fund raising project during this past year. The Committee recognizes that the challenge for 2005/2006 will be to maintain the standards established by this committee during the past year, as well as by previous Ways and Means Committees.

In addition, as a sub-committee of Finance, the members understand the importance of its assignment to raise crucial funds for the operation and programs of UUCSC. The Committee also recognizes the challenge of designing events, which appeal to a broad spectrum of people including families with small children.

For the coming fiscal year, the Committee has voted to experiment with dividing the annual service auction into two events. With this plan, the first auction scheduled for Saturday, October 1, 2005, will include donations offered October 8, 2005, through April 1, 2006. The second auction, scheduled for Saturday, March 4, 2006, will include donations offered March 19, 2006, through October 15, 2006. The reasons for this decision are:

1. To shorten the auction process for each evening which could allow for a more relaxed and fun evening.
2. To provide two opportunities for members and friends to offer donations.
3. To allow bidders and donators an easier process to plan their calendars by dividing up the year into two auction periods.
4. To spread the income from the auction into two installments for the fiscal year.
5. To encourage new members joining after October 1 to become a part of the auction process at the second event.

SCHEDULE OF SOME PROPOSED FUN(D) RAISERS FOR 2005/2006
