The meeting was called to order at 11:37 a.m. for the purpose of transacting business in accordance with the Tapestry bylaws

2. President's Award: The award for outstanding service was presented by Lynn to Penny Kinnear for her years of service as Tapestry's treasurer.
 3. Report of the Treasurer: This report was through May 2016 and there are still some pledges that need to be counted and Theresa will be sending out reminders so we can close out June 2016. Fundraising and Service auction were on target. Theresa successfully organized renters for our building which amounted to \$11,470 in income. Expenses in leadership salaries were slightly lower due to no music director for several months. Building rent and utilities are higher than budgeted due to extra expenses for the common area maintenance. Penny explained that we had to pay more HOA costs for common use projects and they were higher than budgeted this past year. Cash accounts as of June 8th totaled \$500,668. year. J.S. asked if we get the \$25,000 letter of credit back when we leave Madero and Penny assured him we do.

2016-17 Accomplishments	<p>The choir continues to work hard and sing diligently in our Tapestry services approximately twice per month. A few highlights from this year: in December, the choir sang a total of six new songs, for four different services. Christmas Eve was particularly successful, with 11 participating. In February, they performed a piece by local UU composer Karl Lisovsky, who was in attendance. In the month of April, we purchased and learned a setting of an Emily Dickinson poem, then sang it for Flower Communion Sunday. I am very proud and happy with their hard work and dedication to quality music-making. We are also having a great time of fellowship and camaraderie at our rehearsals. Our last monthly Mini Retreat was on May 14, with nine in attendance. Our next one is scheduled for June 11.</p>

2016-17 Accomplishments	<p>We once again scheduled guest speakers for open pulpit services throughout the year. However, as Rev. Kent was on Sabbatical from late June until late September, we filled 14 consecutive open pulpit Sundays during that period alone. This included six services by guest speakers: Rev. Arvid Straube, Gustavo Areano, Rev Tom Owen-Towle, Mar Cardenas, Rev Lee Marie Sanchez, and Eric Gardner, and eight open pulpit services involving Tapestry members, including two "This I Believe" services on Theological Perspectives, a talk on the Challenges of Technology by Dave Salah, a Music Sunday organized by Melissa, separate presentations on Race Issues by Celia Young and members of the Race Matters Discussion Group, a Reader's Theater on Resilience, and a Water Communion conducted by the Worship Committee. Carrying the congregation successfully through the Sabbatical, (we continued to fill the church and attract new members throughout the period)), was one of three major achievements by Worship this year.</p> <p>Upon Kent's return, we worked with him to optimize the worship experience, including arranging for weekly flower arrangements to enhance the services (organized and largely funded by Connie Pursell), working with the AV Committee to replace Jake Hoiseth (with Dave Kinnear) and work through sound and video issues (with training sessions and the purchase of new equipment.)</p> <p>We also maintained pulpit supplies and assisted Worship Associates where needed. We arranged for 8 more open pulpit services between October and May. These involved four services with guest speakers Lydia Natoolo, Dick Whittaker, Rev. James Ford, and Michael Esalun. There were also four services involving Tapestry members, a "This I Believe" service on Relationships, another Music service, a Reader's Theater on Acceptance, and a Christmas Day reading of "A Christmas Carol".</p> <p>A second major achievement of the year was working with Kent to develop a select group of trained Worship Associates. The committee <u>Worship Committee cont'd.</u> selected WA's into November. After that, the new system went into effect, assuring a regular schedule for WA's and, with training conducted by Kent with the assistance of the committee, has assured a high standard of performance. This also freed the committee from having to select WA's on an ongoing basis, sometimes on short notice.</p> <p>Finally, committee members worked with Kent and the AV staff on the third major achievement of the year, the implementation of live streaming of services to Laguna Beach. So far two services have been streamed with a plan of two streamed services each month in the future.</p>
2017-18 Goals	We will continue to schedule open pulpit services and work with Kent and our Worship Associates to improve services. We will work with our AV team to assure a smooth transition mid-year into our new home in Lake Forest.

Budgetary Needs	Outside speakers seem to draw larger crowds to open pulpit services, but these add to our budgetary needs. We therefore will endeavor to restrict outside speakers to slightly more than half of our open pulpit services. We propose ten guest speakers, half ministers and half lay, which will cost about \$2000. Flowers are a considerable expense and have not been funded in the past. We cannot continue to fund this ourselves and propose \$500 for this expense. Kent has been charging the theme support material from UUA to our budget – this amounts to \$300 and has not been budgeted in the past. Pulpit expenses are nominal – we propose about \$100 to cover chalice oil and other supplies. This sums to \$2900 for our budget request.

Minister’s Report - June 2017

What a year. I don’t think it is news to anyone that Tapestry continues to grow. We have been growing for the past couple of years. This year the pressure of American politics pushed our growth into a faster pace. Now, with around 174 members Tapestry is larger than it has ever been. This is exciting and slightly challenging.

Sometimes the larger a community gets, the harder it can be to feel connected. Tapestry has always been a friendly congregation. You can feel it on Sunday mornings and at the huge number of social events we enjoy. As we grow, I encourage us all to keep reaching out and making ourselves available. The depth of our relationships and the power of our ministry will always be more important number of members we have.

Also, as we grow it can be hard to know where you fit. Newcomers can feel like this isn’t fully their home yet, and long-time members can feel uneasy as their home changes with unfamiliar faces. But this is everyone’s community. It doesn’t matter how long you have been with us. Dig in, reach out, and spread the love.

Beyond being a friendly congregation, Tapestry is also a generous one. The push to purchase our building has displayed that generosity in high relief this year. Members have been incredibly generous with their money and their time. I want to be clear, that doesn't just mean huge financial gifts or hundreds of hours spent. Some people have been able to offer those things. I have also seen people offering what they can out of their limited income and their overscheduled lives. It is all important and it all adds up. As we move into a new home the need for your help continues. We will be calling on you as we begin to move furniture, paint walls, add landscaping, and a thousand other projects that will depend on various gifts of money, time, and skills.

Our vision of beloved community isn't just for those within our walls. Together we continue to speak out for justice and learn about the systems of oppression that touch all our lives. While Friends of Orange County Detainees and Green Sanctuary have grown in their size and impact, the Women's Rights Action Group emerged from deep sense of urgency following the 2017 Women's March. Also this year, the Race Matters group offered transformational learning opportunities about systemic racism. I am so proud that this relatively small congregation is making such a profound impact on our community.

Last, but not least, Tapestry is blessed with an amazing staff. Each one of our staff members brings skill and passion that far exceeds expectation. For Katelynn, Kathy, Melissa and Nathan working for Tapestry is more than a job; it is supporting a community they believe in.

By all accounts this past year has been amazing. Like all of you I am incredibly excited for the future of this wonderful congregation.

Consideration and adoption of bylaws to add Standing Committees as follows:

Aesthetics Committee

The purpose of the Aesthetics Committee is to assure that any permanent or semi-permanent addition or change that affects the visual aspect of the church building or grounds is attractive and in line with Tapestry's values. The committee consists of three Tapestry members who are appointed by the Board of Trustees. One member of the committee is to be appointed each year.

Building and Grounds Committee

The purpose of the Building and Grounds Committee is to attend to the upkeep and improvement of Tapestry's building and grounds. Responsibilities include performing minor repairs when possible, collecting bids from outside professionals when necessary, and supervising janitorial staff. The committee will also assist renters with access and use of the building. The committee consists of three Tapestry members appointed by the Board of Trustees. Members of the committee serve a two-year term and may be re-appointed.
