## PRESIDENT'S PONDERINGS



I continue to be amazed by the generosity and support of Tapestry's members and friends for our quest to purchase Tapestry's new home. Last month there were many unknowns. Would our *Raise the Roof* campaign get even close to what we needed for a down payment? Would we find an architect who would work with us? Would someone swoop in with an offer on the building we want?

We now have a healthy down payment. The architect who worked with us on the floor plan for our current facility at Madero is on board again. And we've learned so much from her already—mostly that there are a lot of considerations, questions, and decisions ahead of us. Is there asbestos? Did anyone store hazardous chemicals there? What rating is the electrical service? Are there sprinklers? How thick do the firewalls need to be? And things change fast. Interest rates have gone up. We will need to pay points. The Comprehensive Planning Committee will be working through all of this and more.

Since we've gotten this far and are confident of our ability to make a purchase, I approached the Spirit Level Foundation. The foundation's original purpose was to make grants for "improvements to physical facilities or for purchase of such facilities of UU congregations in Southern California." Their logo is even a builder's level. Tapestry has already benefitted twice from their generosity. First, in 2013 we received a matching grant to fund several projects to help us grow through enhancements to our Sunday morning worship, extra hours for our office administrator, seed funding for our music director, our Reader's Theatre productions, and more. Just last month, Friends of Orange County Detainees received a Spirit Level grant to support their outreach efforts. Although the Foundation has already been so generous and their 2016 deadline for grant applications has passed, we're only going to buy a building once (at least I hope so). So, I asked if they'd be willing to consider an application for a special grant. And they didn't say no. In a stroke of luck, their board is meeting in July to review another congregation's special grant. If we complete our application quickly, they will review it. There are no guarantees and if we are given a grant, we may need to raise more money to match it. As I've mentioned before, every dollar we have for the down payment reduces our payments for years to come. So it's well worth pursuing.

As we move through the purchase process, I'll continue to send you updates. It still promises to be a roller coaster of highs and lows, of joys and concerns. And we've got a great group of folks holding on for the duration of the ride.

## *TREASURER'S REPORT ENDING JUNE 2016*

**Income:** Current period income was \$83,869, or \$62,185 above budget and included \$3,000 Q4 prepayment from M. Ferguson. Excluding contributions to Capital Campaign & Move in Costs, income was \$19,769, which is \$1,915 below budget. I wrote off \$3,430 in pledge loss in June. Hoping to receive some outstanding pledges in July. Reminders. have been sent.

**Year to Date Total Income: \$399,001**

**Expenses not counting Spirit Grant Offset:** Total operating expenses for the period were \$24,984, which is above the planned budget of \$23,588, or \$1,396. I did transfer \$12,000 from the Spirit Level Grant, making our expenses \$12,984, which is under budget by \$5,662.

**Year to Date Total Expenses: \$278,792**

**Income less Expenses:** Current Period income (NOT INCLUDING CAPITAL) less expenses was \$6,785.

## *NEW HOME FOR TAPESTRY*

### **ONE STEP FORWARD AND TWO ..... OR THREE MORE STEPS FORWARD**

#### ***TAPESTRY MEMBERSHIP VOTES TO AUTHORIZE BOARD TO MOVE FORWARD ON A NEW HOME***

*Thank you, Tapestry! We had a sanctuary full of members who enthusiastically voted to support the Board of Trustees' efforts to purchase a permanent home for us. Here's what you approved:*

- *That we support the Board of Trustees in its research to purchase a new, permanent home for Tapestry.*
- *That the Tapestry Board of Trustees make a deposit to open escrow on our first priority building.*
- *That we authorize a capital campaign in three overlapping phases to raise the down payment, move-in expenses, and architectural improvements for a building for a permanent home for Tapestry.*
- *That the congregation approve the receipt of a UUA building loan, or similar loan from another lender, for the purchase of a building for Tapestry's new home.*

These votes get us started. There's still a long road ahead to obtaining a mortgage from a lender and raising the funds we need short- and long-term. In the next several weeks, we'll be learning a lot more about what's possible and we'll keep you informed. When things work out and we have a clear way forward, we'll have another congregational meeting where members will vote to purchase a specific building and assume specific amounts for a mortgage and ongoing operating expenses. Next steps are to launch the first phase of the capital campaign for the down payment to build lenders' confidence in our financial commitment. Thank you, congregation for supporting your leaders to obtain a new home for Tapestry. We are encouraged by your unanimous support and commitment to obtaining the best option.




## CALLING ALL TAPESTRY MOMS




