## PRESIDENT'S PONDERINGS



It's hard to believe that 2016 is coming to an end in only a few weeks. I saw a Facebook post that said, "Only 10 Fridays until Christmas!" Yikes. Tapestry's got a lot to do to close out this year. Thanks to everyone who offered and bid on items in our Fall auction. Your generosity in purchases is a key part of our operating budget that sustains our day-to-day expenses.

The Board just had its annual "retreat," a few hours away from Tapestry to reflect on our vision and put our work at Tapestry in a larger context. It's important for us to take the time away from immediacy of the day to make sure we are on track and prepared for what the future will bring, and how it will influence our decisions and missions. For example, we talked about the possibilities of building a library of virtual reality experiences to "walk in another's shoes" and experience discrimination, poverty, and personal challenges to inspire social action in a compelling way. Will self-driving cars deliver Tapestrians to services in the future? Can drones drop off meals to contagious shut-ins? Will Rev. Kent deliver a sermon as a hologram in our very own living rooms? Or will Tapestry be an anchor of liberal spirituality, an oasis that provides a personal touch you can't get through technology? A hug. A handshake. An in-depth conversation complete with tone of voice and body language instead of typed characters on a screen? Live music where you can sing along?

While streaming services will be a technology innovation as part of our future collaboration with the UU Fellowship of Laguna Beach, the Board, committees and all Tapestrians can look for ways to use technology to enable our vision and extend our reach into the community of like-minded folks.

In the meantime, the Board and key Tapestrians continue to work through the many issues related to purchasing our forever home that will anchor us and give us the space and flexibility to carry out our mission. The response to our Letter of Intent for the warehouse at 22951 Alcalde is on the back burner since the owner wants an unattainable closing date. The owner at 23676 Birtcher didn't go for our low ball price, but is willing to continue discussions. Our agent is continuing to pursue our many options in negotiating a deal that will work for us.

We'll need to be making a few decisions soon when we have more data. In the meantime, there's our Tapestry's Got Talent event, the Holiday Boutique, and much more. Make sure to check the website calendar and watch Facebook so you don't miss anything!
