PRESIDENT'S PONDERINGS



Many thanks to all of you last month who reached deep and made a financial pledge for Tapestry's 2017-2018 annual campaign. Fittingly, the theme was "A Home for All." And I am happy to report that Tapestry is still inching closer to purchasing a bricks and mortar home for all of us. We had a setback when the sellers had to change attorneys, but the paperwork is progressing again. I've said it before and hope it will be true that we will soon sign the purchase agreement and start with inspections, floor plans, and the myriad of decisions that lie ahead.

In March, we held a pilot focus group meeting on small groups at Tapestry. Participants shared their thoughts on what they liked about the groups we have, like the various book groups, moms' group, the HeArt of Spirituality, and others. We also discussed other groups we might start like Covenant Groups, where participants commit to meet regularly to share more deeply on spiritual topics or questions. One unexpected topic was how to make it easier for newcomers to meet people and how to welcome them into existing groups. We'll factor that feedback into the sessions that will be held in April. Until then, think about what you might like to see in small groups at Tapestry. While a focus group might sound dull, they are anything but. One thing for certain is that UUs love to express their opinions and here's a chance for you to share yours.

In the meantime, here's a request that came out of the pilot group. Before and after the service, in addition to catching up with friends, take a moment to speak to someone you don't know or don't know very well. It can be hard to know how to begin but it is well worth the effort. For someone I don't recognize, my favorite opener is, "I don't believe we've met. I'm Lynn." Sometimes I'm wrong and we have a laugh over about when we did meet. A generic, "What's going on with you?" or "What have you been up to?" can lead into all kinds of interesting conversations. And that kind of connection is what makes Tapestry the welcoming community it is.

MINISTERIAL PERSPECTIVES



The time has arrived. For several months leaders at Tapestry and the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Laguna Beach have been talking about forming a partnership. We are excited to be working together in a few different ways.

Already our Office Administrator has taken on most of the office tasks from Laguna Beach. The arrangement has provided increased efficiency for the congregations, and created a more robust Office Administrator job with more hours. Laguna Beach is reimbursing Tapestry for the increased hours.

In April, we will begin a live video feed for Sunday morning worship. Two Sundays each month the congregations will worship together. The majority of the worship service will be live at Tapestry and will be very similar to our standard Sunday morning experience. We will have an additional short

greeting from the worship associate at Laguna Beach. We will also hear from Laguna Beach as their worship associate reads any celebrations and concerns.

The technology is somewhat complicated and there will probably be a few glitches along the way. We sought to build a worship experience that truly connects the two worshipping communities in one unified experience. Thank you, in advance, for your patience and understanding. This is an opportunity for Tapestry to live our mission of being a leader in South Orange County.

In addition to worship, we hope to team up on other activities. The top priorities for coordination are justice projects and our ministries at Laguna Woods. We also plan to have a joint social gathering in Laguna Beach in the next few months, so stay tuned for more info.

***Hope in the Dark: Untold Histories, Wild Possibilities* by Rebecca Solnit**

Drawing on her decades of activism and a wide reading of history, Solnit argues that radicals have a long, neglected history of transformative victories, that the positive consequences of our acts are not always immediately seen, and that pessimism and despair rest on an unwarranted confidence about what is going to happen next. In this historically inspired novel, Brooks takes on one of literature's richest and most enigmatic figures: a man who shimmers between history and legend. 
